PRESIDENT'S COMMENTS

Welcome to the 2001 Winter/Spring issue of the Princeton Association of New England Newsletter. We have had an exciting and fun-packed Fall season, ranging from a well-received TIGERS AHOY Cruise on Boston Harbor for new and old alums, to a Tigerlillies performance at the PANE/Snowden High School Mentoring Program, to Professor Shirley Tilghman's provocative presentation on Princeton's integrative genomics project. As promised, we have been very busy and are set to deliver a greater variety of attractive alumni events, member services and community outreach opportunities under the PANE umbrella.

In furtherance of our celebration of the Centennial Anniversary of the Princeton Graduate School, I wish to extend both an institutional and personal welcome to the 746 Graduate Alums who reside and work within Eastern Massachusetts. Now that we have found you through improved TigerNet data compilation, please come and join Jeremy Kepner *98, Wesley Harris *68, Richard Heitman *53, Vivien Li *83, and the rest of the PANE membership in the balance of the year's activities.

I would like to offer a few comments regarding two new PANE initiatives. First, the PANE board is reviewing a proposal to create a PANE Mentoring Program Endowment Fund to support the Snowden/Princeton and Friends Mentoring Program in perpetuity. The goal is to follow the model of our very successful PANE Scholarship Fund with a modest investment of funds from PANE and other contributors. When I discussed this matter with the mentoring program's co-founder, Doug Nadeau '62, he offered a challenge grant of \$2,500, provided that PANE invested \$5,000, allowing the endowment to start with \$10,000. The PANE board will be reviewing this project over the next three months and we invite your comments about this initiative.

A second initiative involves the national efforts of Rosalie Norair '76, Chair of the National Committee on Schools (NCS), and Amanda Samuel '92, Chair of the NCS Subcommittee on Minority Recruitment and the Association of Black Princeton Alumni (ABPA) Student Recruitment Committee, to increase the yield of admitted minority students to Princeton to match the overall average yield of 69 percent. The Admissions Office reports that, for the Class of 2004, the yield on Native American admits was 60 percent; on Asian American admits, 57 percent; on Hispanic American admits, 50 percent; and on African American admits, 46 percent. In contrast, the yield on non-minority admits was over 80 percent. The University is losing a high percentage of highly qualified minority students to other universities and colleges, and the NCS is reaching out to all of its Alumni School Committees, especially those in areas of the country with high concentrations of minority students who decline to attend Princeton, to help the Admissions Office to enhance its recruitment success rate.

The challenge for PANE is to encourage every area Princetonian to work with the NCS, the PANE ASC, and the PANE/ABPA Collaboration to convince every admitted minority student of the benefits of a Princeton education. PANE's ASC Chair John Hart '66 and Vice-Chairs Charles Anderson '83 and Mary Ellen Alessandro '88 have created programs to reach out to minority students, students gifted in math, and other talented students by developing closer relationships with targeted area high schools. These initiatives need your support, and I encourage you to get involved with these programs by volunteering your time and talents. You can make a big difference in the future of Princeton and in the lives of all students who elect to attend Princeton!
