Wednesday, September 10 – PANE at the MFA Thomas Gainsborough Exhibition

As you may know, the Museum of Fine Arts, Boston has a major exhibit of the works of Thomas Gainsborough (1727-1788), one of the foremost British artists and one of greatest portrait painters in history. The exhibition, which runs through September 14, features over ninety works by Gainsborough from fifty different lenders on both sides of the Atlantic, including Queen Elizabeth II. The display also includes examples of eighteenth-century furniture, decorative arts, musical instruments, and costumes to bring the Georgian era to life.

The curator for this exhibit is a Princeton alumnus, Frederick Ilchman '90, who has graciously agreed to provide an introductory talk on Gainsborough and the exhibit on Wednesday, September 10 at 7:00 p.m. After the short lecture, you are free to tour the exhibit on your own. Frederick Ilchman will be available inside the exhibition to answer any questions you may have. Tickets for the Gainsborough exhibition are half price on Wednesday evenings (\$10), so this is a wonderful opportunity!

- Those attending the introductory talk should meet at the MFA on the second floor of the West Wing, near the entrance to the exhibition. Note: There is a service charge if you order from the web site or by phone.
- Whether you are picking up reserved tickets or buying them in person, please arrive at the Museum at least fifteen minutes early to give yourself plenty of time.
- Please note that we will be standing for the talk.
- The whole museum is open on Wednesdays until 9:45 p.m., with admission by voluntary donation, so this would be an ideal time to explore the new American galleries, including those devoted to Colonial Arts (esp. John Singleton Copley) and John Singer Sargent.

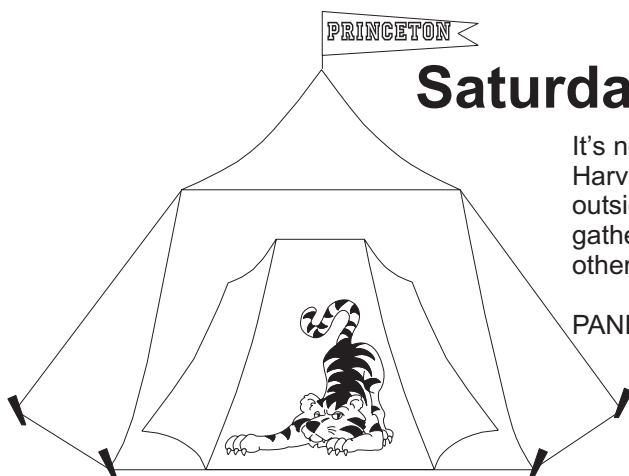
PANE Dues and Donations: Deductible and Eligible for Corporate Matching Gifts !!
